FOREWORD

Psalm 126:2-6 (NIV)

2 Our mouths were filled with laughter, our tongues with songs of joy. Highlights of the Lusaka Mission- in the eyes of the earliest Evangelist Emmanuel Kopwe former Team Leader Tanzania

LUSAKA MISSION: A GLIMPSE FROM THE PAST...

"God is faithful, and you were called by Him to partnership with His Son, Jesus Christ our Lord". 1 Cor 1:9, CEB

The Lusaka Mission Celebrated God. Celebrating 60 years of ministry, and the privilege of being graced with the presence of the people who dared obey God (Dr Michael Cassidy is iconic). The Mission/Celebration was the harvesting of a seed planted in the first mission some 30 plus years ago. Paul tells us that God is faithful. I can't help but agree with Paul at the trustworthiness, reliability, and dependability of God; all these years and during the mission in Lusaka. I also recognize that our calling is not just "fellowship" as many translations would say, but the translation I quote underlines "partnership" with Jesus. "Partnership is an arrangement where parties, known as partners, agree to cooperate to advance their mutual interests." The Lusaka Mission can be a good springboard to prayerfully propel us into a future with properly founded four partnership perspectives:

Can we all (including those we carry along to the mission field) claim we are properly knitted, hinged, and in one accord with Jesus? (John 17:21-24)

Do we do due diligence to build on the local partnership (as per our mission statement) for mutual interests?





How about the in-house fellowship? If you read J. R. R. Tolkien's Fellowship of the Ring, nine individuals from different races, personalities, and different opinions: held each other accountable, defended each other, fought together for what was good... We need to be deliberately concerned of the needs of each other, to build morale and unity.

How sustainable is the preservation plan for the mutual fruit? As we get excited of the past we can see, we better be diligent in prayer and action in search of the partnership for the future we aspire.

- Give thanks that God chose us to partner with him
- Pray that there will be accountability in our relationships that will honour God
- Pray that the Father will make us pure and holy as he sends us into the world to glorify Him
- Pray John 17 v 21-24. Pray that we will be one just as the Father and Son are one

LOOKING BEYOND 60 YEARS, "SUFFICIENCY OF SCRIPTURE"

"And the things you have heard from me among many witnesses, commit these to faithful men who will be able to teach others also" (2Tim. 2:2)

In reflecting upon this passage of scripture, the best gift Christian leaders can pass on to the next generation is a culture, built in the orthodoxy of the sufficiency of Scripture. Scripture unites us. We may have a thousand divergent views, but we should find a sense of unity if fidelity in reading and passing on the untainted Word of God is given pre-eminence in any and all engagements.

Looking beyond 60 years requires looking back to critically analyze the binding factors that stood out as distinctive for African Enterprise, amidst the varying cultural contexts within which each national office is found. Fidelity to the Word of God remains exceptional in my view.

The Apostle Paul, in seeking to describe the infrastructure within which the Word of God should be passed on from one generation to another, says "And the things you have heard from me among many witnesses, commit these to faithful men who will be able to teach others also "(2Tim. 2:2). The key points to note in this text is the need to pass the word on to "faithful men" who will in turn "Teach others". In other words, Paul is saying that in order to preserve the gospel for coming generations, we need to do two things.





- 1. Identify faithful men. Reliable men committed to the course of Christ.
- 2. Commission them to teach others.

Beyond 60 years, **AE** should remain at the forefront of equipping the next generation of church leaders, evangelists, pastors, and most importantly the next generation of reliable young men. The net results will be an acceleration of the gospel through a multiplier effect, beyond what individuals can accomplish. We are stewards of the mysteries of God.

- As we start to identify recruits for the AE School of evangelism, pray that the Lord will enable each team to get faithful men that are dependable.
- Pray that the Lord will provide the necessary resources required to effectively train individuals.
- Pray that AE will take its rightful place in the arena of catalyzing the church to greater heights of productivity in the Great Commission (Mission and Evangelism)

GOD'S FAITHFULNESS

"Lord, you must hear my prayer, for you are faithful to your promises. Answer my cry, O righteous God!" Psalm 143:1 (TPT)

Joining Biggie Paul, International Prayer Coordinator, the Prayer Coordinators of National teams and local intercessors who met before the Lusaka for Jesus Mission was such a privilege. We came, confident that the One who had answered prayers for the ministry of African Enterprise through 60 years, would meet with us; show us what was on His heart, and, as we aligned our heart with His as we prayed, He would answer.

Intercessors were assigned to the seven bases from which missioners went daily and at least two intercessors were at each base through the time the stratified evangelism was taking place. Ann and I were assigned to the Emmasdale Base, with Biggie, meeting the missioners for prayer every morning, sending them out with prayer and blessing. Biggie received updates for prayer so that we could seek the Lord for answers to specific needs as they occurred.

What joy to welcome the missioners back and hear their reports of answered prayer. He more than proved His presence with those who went in obedience to the Great Commission. The Lord is faithful to His promises. He wants everyone to come to repentance (2 Peter 3:6). Jesus promised, "I, when I am lifted up from the earth, will draw all people to myself" (John 12:32). As Jesus was proclaimed in Lusaka, people responded to the good news. The months of prayer before Missions for prepared hearts was answered. Each day the Lord led us to pray for a specific group: those in bondage to addictions; people needing healing; those who had wandered away from the Good Shepherd; churches in Lusaka; leaders to have the heart of the Father as new lambs came into the sheepfold





We were asked to pray for stolen documents (recovered); more cows (5 were given which provided needed supplies); hosts for unexpected arrivals (all needs were met); delays at the borders (Kubamba Krew and Heaven's Gates Hell's Flames did make it!); the phenomenal logistics required for such a mission and the AESAR and AEI teams; we prayed outside the supermarket adjacent to Soweto Market while the Serve the City Finale took place (people kneeling on the ground, surrendering their lives to Jesus); some alcoholics came to Jesus; marriages were reconciled; people were healed and delivered; a young Mother with her little boy was provided with a meal and the means to return home after being found by missioners collapsed by the road.

The passage in Job 22 vs.21-30, encouraged us to bring ourselves into alignment with God, putting Him first, seeking His will and way, with the promise of answered prayer and light on our way as we lift clean hands to Him. Looking forward, Holding True, Pressing on is the AE@60 motto. Whatever part we play in Evangelising the Cities of Africa in Word and Deed in Partnership with the Church we can do nothing without Him. Spending the time in Lusaka interceding was a most wonderful experience, as Zephaniah 2:3 (AMP) reminded me, "Seek the Lord [search diligently for Him and regard Him as the foremost necessity of your life]."

- Praise the Lord for his faithfulness in answering prayer.
- Thank God for the light of Jesus that shone from the missioners as they went into the field.
- Rejoice that so many responded to the Good News presented in Lusaka.
- Pray for the nurture and care of new believers.
- Pray that churches will continue to work together to reach their communities by word and deed.
- Pray that what was planted in Lusaka will bear fruit for the kingdom in Zambia.

THANKSGIVING Thanksgiving brings down the glory of God.

"13 Those who blew the trumpets and those who sang together sounded like one person as they praised and thanked the Lord. They sang as others played their trumpets, cymbals, and other instruments. They praised the Lord with this song: "He is good; his love continues forever." Then the Temple of the Lord was filled with a cloud. 14 The priests could not continue their work because of the cloud, because the Lord's glory filled the Temple of God. "2 Chron 5:13-14 (NLT)

In 2 Chronicles 5:13-14, when high praises and thanksgiving was rendered to God, His glory filled His house and the priests could not stand. PRAYER IS A PLACE OF ENCOUNTER WITH GOD

"...the Lord never intended for prayer to be something we do merely out of duty or to get specific results.

First and foremost, prayer is about encountering God and growing in relationship with Him. It is the means by which we most feel His presence and receive love from Him as we gain understanding of what He is like. It is the time when we receive fresh insight into His heart and when new desires in our hearts are formed so that we may commune deeply with Him.

Prayer positions us to be energized to love—to love God and people. This is the foundational principle of prayer. Yes, it is biblical to pray to get answers and to see God's power. But prayer is first of all an opportunity to commune with God. The call to prayer is a call to participate in the love that has forever burned in God's heart.

From eternity past the Father has loved the Son with all His heart, and the Son has loved the Father with the same intensity. The primary factor in the Father's relationships, both within the Godhead and with His people, is wholehearted love...
