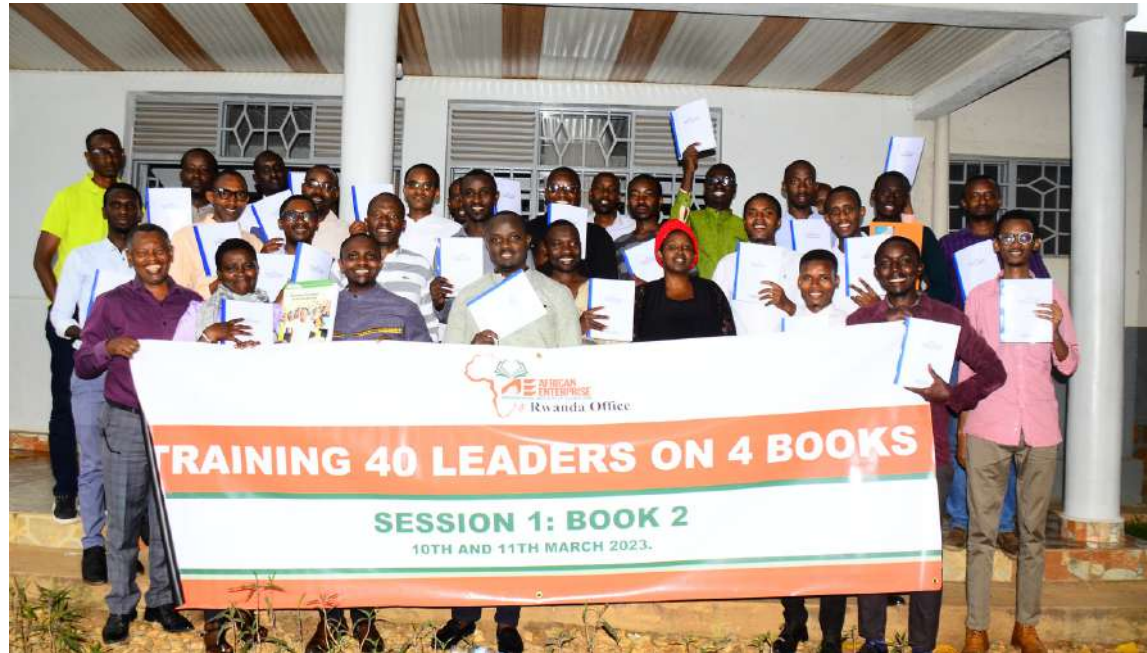

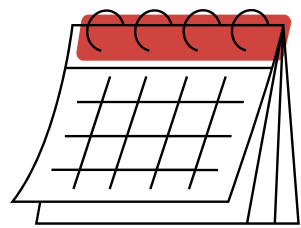

Atakpame Mission

We thank God for the Atakpame mission in Ghana where 137,000 people heard the word of God and 4700 made a decision to get saved.

The mission took place from 17th-26th March, 2023 and involved a series of events: Serve the city, Youth and children events, Women's meetings, evangelism training, leadership meetings, film evangelism, Radio ministry and a Mission to the University of Ghana.

RADIO

One of the amazing doors the Lord opened for AE Ghana was ministry through radio. Two evangelists preached on 'Radio La Paix', which has over 50,000 listeners.

Evangelist Moise from Congo Brazzaville and Evangelist Bakare from Burkina Faso preached there on 17th and 24th February.





DURBAN MISSION

Our South Africa team carried out Durban Mission In March this year. 350 children gave their lives to the Lord.

While on the mission, a lady was instantly healed, after Xenia, an AE missionary volunteer prayed for her! She was suffering from the after-effects of a stroke and had difficulty walking necessitating the use a crutch; she also could not raise her left arm at all. Immediately after the prayer she realised that something had changed. she left her crutch and started walking around the pews in the church, which she couldn't do before, then started skipping, and lifting both her arms high praising God.

The team also prayed for a lady at the hosting church . She could hardly hear, had trouble seeing, and had deep wrenching pain in her stomach. After the team prayed, we tested her hearing. She could hear meters away: previously she battled to hear . Her eyes were touched. She tested them and could read without seeing stars and becoming dizzy. And the wrenching in her stomach was completely healed. The next morning when the team arrived, she was walking up right and smiling excited about life. She also committed her life to Jesus.

The Lord moved in a great way during the Durban mission that ended with 74 representatives from different churches gathering for a prayer service at KwaMashu LightHouse Bible Church.

We are grateful to God for the healing that took place during the mission and the peaceful protests in South Africa. Let us continue to pray for upcoming missions in July and October.



Discipleship



Approximately 16,000 students were trained in the Students Discipleship Program. The program is carried out in partnership with churches. In one of the training centres, in Jigjiga city, Ethiopia over 140 students attended the training.

The program is very productive in building the spiritual life of students. It is even more fruitful because it helps shape children for the future.

“ I have learnt! ”

Christine Alemnew, a grad student, has attended the discipleship program for two years in a row. She is happy to have joined the training and she feels the program has been very fruitful in building her spiritual and social life.

She says “the first important teaching is the need to read the Bible daily. If I want to fellowship with God and want his guidance, then the Bible is the main source for it. I have learnt how to study the Bible and the importance of daily quiet time. Fellowshiping with Christian students is another benefit of the program. I want to continue with it.”

Trauma Healing Program

The AE South Sudan are hopeful that their Trauma Healing Program will have more schools adopt the program and integrate it as part of their club activities.

Many members have testimonies of healing and transformation through this program.

Head Teachers in 10 primary schools and 6 secondary schools have welcomed the integration of the program, stating that half of the pupils and the students in their respective schools will join this year.

48 Teachers and 32 students leaders in 20 schools attended the meeting discussion on the progress of Trauma Healing Program in Schools this year.

We pray that AE South Sudan will get more funding for the Healing program.

Cholera Interventions

It is estimated that each year there are 1.3 to 4.0 million cases of Cholera with 21,000 to 143,000 deaths worldwide.

According to the International Federation of Red Cross, Malawi experienced its worst Cholera Outbreak in two decades with over 29,000 cases reported and more than 900 people dead.

Our Response

African Enterprise Malawi in partnership with Design Outreach sought to mitigate the effects of the epidemic in the surrounding communities of Namitete area in Lilongwe City. They provided six communities with the awareness on the disease.

Design outreach focused on disseminating information on the prevention of the disease and African Enterprise Malawi preached the gospel through their foxfire ministry. We thank God for the 1,777 people that were reached and the 793 that were saved

Besides receiving the gift of eternal life through the preaching of the gospel, the communities were given chlorine and soap to help in their fight against Cholera,

Design Outreach continues to seek more opportunity to partner with like-minded organisations like us and we hope that the partnership will continue to grow.

According to WHO The long-term solution for Cholera control lies in economic development and universal access to safe drinking water and adequate sanitation. Actions targeting environmental conditions include the implementation of adapted long-term sustainable WASH solutions to ensure use of safe water, basic sanitation and good hygiene practices in Cholera hotspots.

In addition to Cholera, such interventions prevent a wide range of other water-borne illnesses, as well as contributing to achieving goals related to poverty, malnutrition, and education.



Serving the City

Serving the city through environmental cleaning became a precursor to the Atakpame mission. On Saturday, 18th February 2023, about 300 people converged on the main street of Atakpame to clean.

This took place along the streets of Agbo Fucec-Togo to Lycee Agbo and in surrounding areas .

Some of the missionaries took time to share the gospel with community members. At the end of the day, 31 people were saved.

The government representative for the Plateau Region, graced the cleaning exercise. He spoke on behalf of the Prefect to express appreciation to AE for mobilizing the church in Atakpame to tidy up the street.

According to him, the church has demonstrated that they have the welfare of the city and the people at heart. He appealed to the church to continue to partner with the government to bring development to the city, "Our doors are wide open for government and church engagement for the betterment of our people."

While cleaning the street, the president of the pastors' fellowship, Rev. Moustafa Esse, met a group of kids. He shared the gospel with them and thirteen gave their lives to the Lord. The children were encouraged to join a nearby Baptist Church.

Thereafter, the AE Ghana staff discovered that the children were homeless, and began a funds drive to support them. To give towards this initiative please contact info@aeint.org.

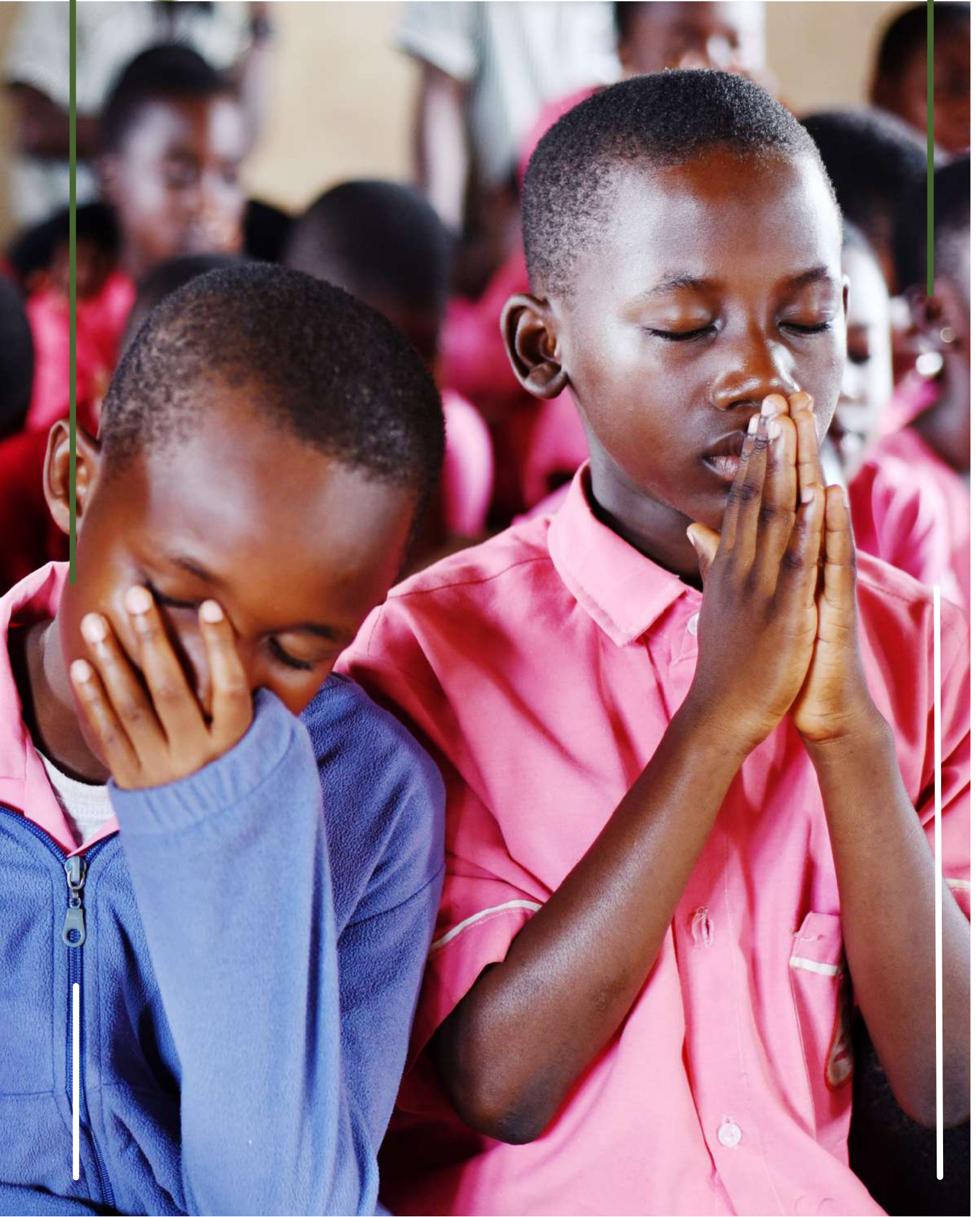
